

## VIC WILLIAMS



The bottom line of 92-year-old Victor Williams' personal appeal to Prime Minister David Cameron says it all: "Please don't abandon us any longer!" The World War II veteran's British pension has been frozen since 1987. When he was busy earning the 1939-45 Star, the Atlantic Star, the Africa Star, the Burma Star, the Italy Star, the 1939-1945 War Medal and the Malta George Cross 50th Anniversary Commemorative Medal, Vic never imagined that seven decades later he would still be on campaign. Most of all, he could not have envisaged that this campaign would be against the very government for which he had put his young life on the line. But people like him are heroes who fight injustice wherever and whenever they find it.

Vic has long played an active role in the campaign for pension justice. He participated in Broken Faith, the book presented at 10 Downing Street in 2010 that featured 'frozen' British veterans who have considered returning their service medals in protest against the government's pension freezing policy. And he frequently lends his energy to the board and volunteers of CABP by supporting us at our annual general meeting.
